THE FLAKEY READING & PRESENTATION

Meeting learning requirements

Scheduling a *Flakey* reading for your school is an exciting learning opportunity for students, and can be tailored to fit each grade's curriculum objectives:

- How a person becomes an author
- The role of publishers / self-publishers
- Writing a first draft, editing and making revisions
- Artistic choices –from illustration to photography
- Symbolism and characters
- Ways to give back to our community
- The concept of 'Alternative Giving'
- The graphic design and printing process

Furthermore, the story teaches these valuable lessons:

- Little things can add up to big things
- Not to judge someone based on their appearance
- Not to value 'things' more than people
- The importance of charity and helping others

The presentation

I begin each program by reading the story and talking a bit about the inspiration behind creating the book. Next, I guide students through the creative process, describe how I crafted the models used in making the book, discuss the reason I moved from illustrations to photography, and explain the theme of the book. With younger students, I concentrate on the ideas of character development and the writing process, while with older students I discuss editing, revision, and publishing.

A highlight among students is having the opportunity to see the actual models used in the making of the book. I always set aside additional time so that students may ask questions and examine the models more closely in small groups. **A typical program is 30-45 minutes per classroom or grade.**

IMPORTANT: I highly encourage the readings to be broken down by grade. Or, if you have a small school, divide the groups into K-1, 2-3, and 4-5. If time does not allow for 3 readings, a breakdown of K-2, and 3-5 at a minimum. The reason for this is to tailor the reading for the appropriate age. When the various ages are all lumped together, I feel that the older students especially don't get as much out of the program as they would otherwise with peers their own age.

FLAKEY WILL INSPIRE YOUR STUDENTS

What other schools have done

In years past, some schools turned their *Flakey* reading into an entire educational day. They integrated writing exercises, artwork, studies about snow and weather, and even a 'snowball' fight in gym! One school hosted a writing competition where students shared stories about helping others. Another school had students create new characters for future *Flakey* stories.

No charge to your school

I am able to forego a speaker fee by asking that schools send *Flakey* book order forms home with students prior to my visit. I can create a customized book order form for your school- see the sample order form on page 6.

I also request that schools allow the greatest number of students possible to participate in the book reading and presentation. Depending on the size of each class, an assembly-style program for each grade can be held in the cafeteria, gymnasium or library. (It's best when I can set up my snowman display and not have to move it.)

A Virginia resident since 1976, Ms. Tubbs grew up in the beautiful Shenandoah Valley amidst apple orchards and cattle farms. She attended Frederick County Public Schools where her interests always surrounded the creative fields– art, drama, writing and music. She went on to graduate Cum Laude from Mary Washington College (now University of Mary Washington) with a Bachelors Degree in fine art and business administration.

Her first 'real' job actually was in the publishing field. She worked in the mailroom of *Selling Power Magazine*- then a growing start-up company. Determined to find an exciting and dynamic career that would continue to challenge her, Ms. Tubbs tried on several hats including the fields of travel & tourism, a non-profit environmental organization, and graphic design. Ultimately, those things she always loved as a child have become her passions and the cornerstones for all that she does.

In its first holiday season, *Flakey* sold about 1,000 copies in the greater Washington, D.C. area. A few online sales sent the book as far as the U.K. and Japan. Now in its second printing, Amy is pleased with her first project and plans to continue pursuing a career in the publishing field with specialty areas in children's fiction, entertaining, and humor.


